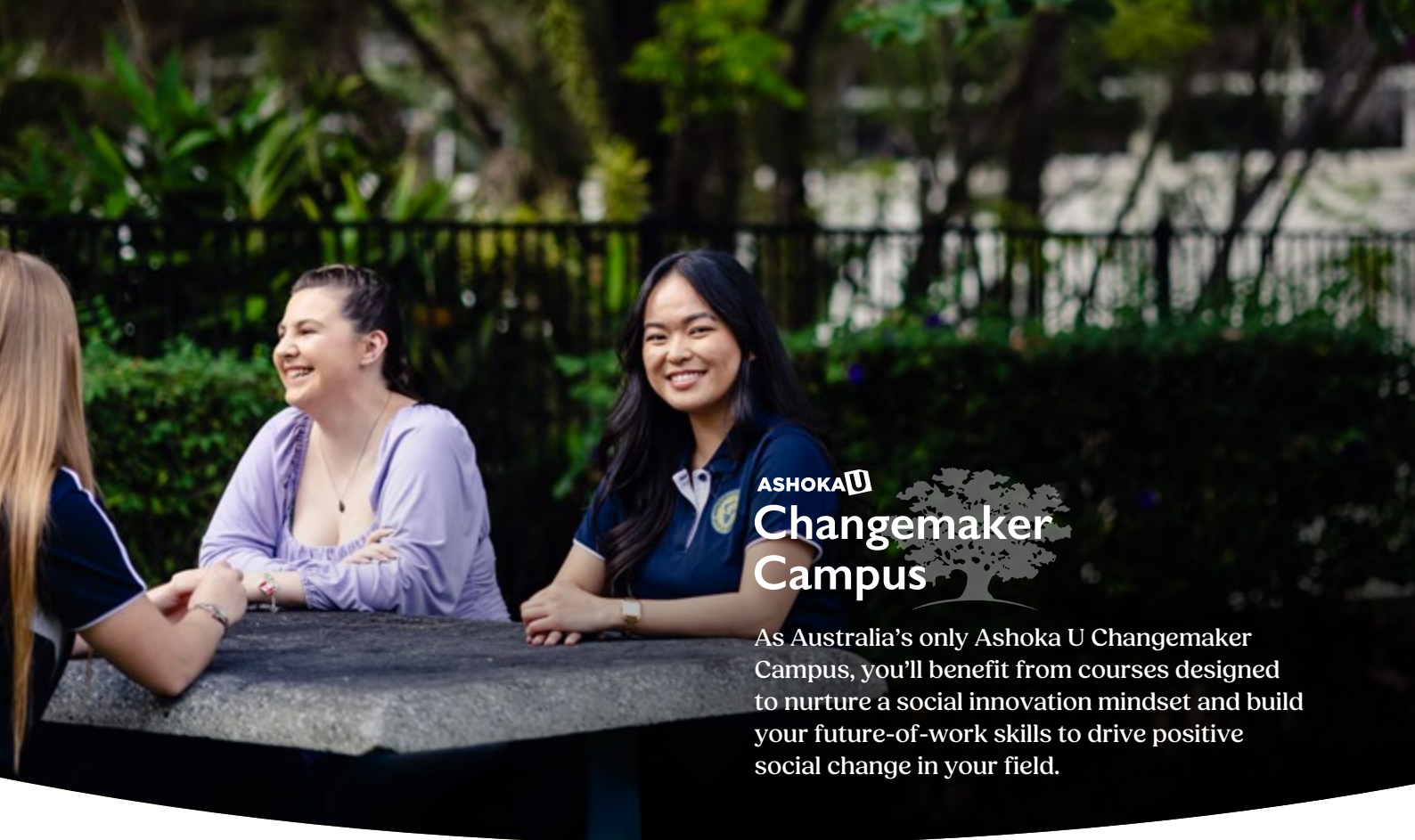

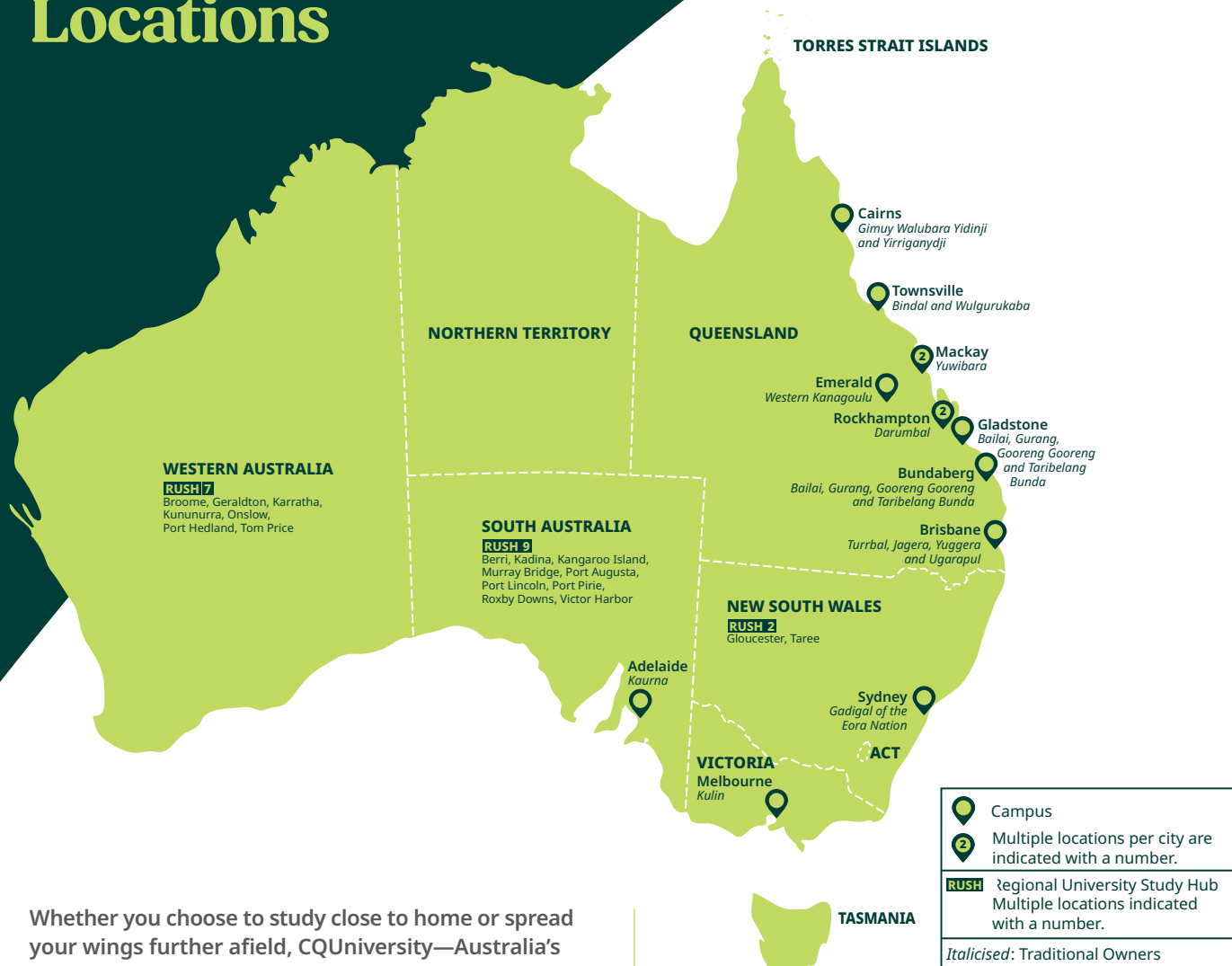

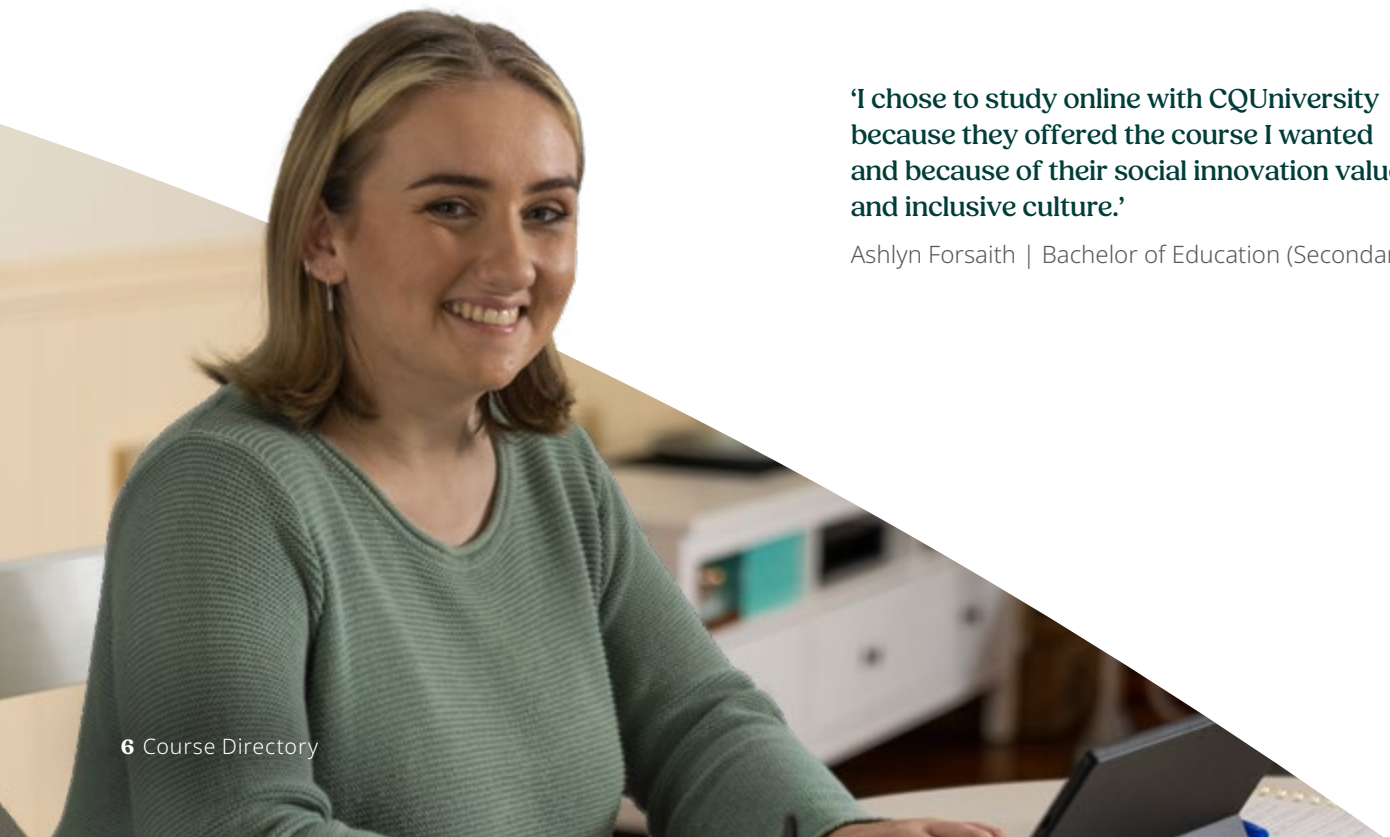

Entry pathways

We understand that everyone's journey is different, so we offer many alternative pathways into our courses.

SKILLS FOR TERTIARY EDUCATION PREPARATORY STUDIES (STEPS)

STEPS is a Centrelink-approved enabling program that has helped thousands of Australians gain entry into university. Tailored to you and your unique study goals, STEPS is designed to help you return to study or work after some time away, complete prerequisite subjects for entry into your chosen degree, or give you the confidence and skills to successfully enter and undertake university study. RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

RPL recognises skills and knowledge that you've acquired through informal learning. This may include workshops, training events, voluntary work or on the job. To obtain RPL, you need to be currently or recently working in the industry that you are wishing to be recognised for.

The RPL process involves an assessment of knowledge, skills and experience. Your skills will be assessed against industry standards by an RPL Assessor after your application and your supporting evidence has been submitted and processed. For more information, visit cqu.edu.au/rpl.

TAFE QUALIFICATION

If you hold a certificate III, certificate IV or diploma qualification, you may meet specified entry score requirements for many of our associate, bachelor and bachelor with honours degrees.

PRINCIPAL'S RECOMMENDATION SCHEME (PRS)

Our PRS provides Year 12 students with an alternate entry pathway, based on their school principal's recommendation rather than an ATAR. It's an ideal pathway for all Year 12 students, especially if you haven't studied for an ATAR, or you've experienced circumstances that may have impacted your senior schooling results. START UNI NOW (SUN)

Our SUN program is a valuable alternate entry pathway for high school students thinking about studying a CQUniversity undergraduate course. After successful completion of a SUN unit during your senior high school years, you may be eligible to apply for direct entry into your preferred course (excluding quota-managed courses) and receive credit towards your degree. START TAFE NOW (STN)

Our STN program is ideal for Year 11 and 12 students, providing an opportunity to study certificate I, certificate II, certificate III, and certificate IV level courses in a wide variety of disciplines.

In Queensland, you can study a TAFE course as part of your Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE), and earn QCE points. To be eligible, you need to be at least 15 years of age at the commencement of classes. For more information, visit cqu.edu.au/stn.

Fees and scholarships

CQUniversity is committed to making education accessible. We offer competitive fees along with a generous variety of scholarships.

COSTS AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The cost of a course varies depending on what you are studying. You may also need to factor in other costs, such as living expenses, stationery, textbooks and equipment, including safety glasses, laboratory coats, gym clothes or a uniform. The Australian Government offers a number of financial support programs, like VET Student Loans, HECS-HELP, FEE-HELP and OS-HELP to support eligible students while studying. COURSE

Use the course code and course name to search our website cqu.edu.au and find out more about the courses you're interested in. TAFE courses may be marked with ⓘ. This means the course may be delivered via the Start TAFE Now (STN) program.

INTAKE

Intake is the time of year you can start a course. We have three terms: Term 1 starts in March, Term 2 starts in July and Term 3 starts in November. TAFE courses may list the months they begin, or 'multiple', which means they may have many intakes so it's best to check our website. 'Anytime' relates to our hyperflexible online courses where study is self-paced and you can start at any time throughout the year.

The Bachelor of Health Science provides you with foundational knowledge in health sciences and is an ideal pathway to honours and postgraduate allied health study.

For a career as a chiropractor the bachelor followed by the master combine to create a two-part study sequence required to achieve full registration as a chiropractor.



Our Certificate III and IV in Dental Assisting teaches you practical skills to assist in supporting dental applications, and the Bachelor of Oral Health allows you to apply for registration as an oral health therapist.

More study options

OPPORTUNITIES FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

If you're in high school, CQUniversity provides opportunities for you to study Vocational Education and Training (VET) or higher education units while still at school, meaning you may be able to graduate from CQUniversity earlier.

START UNI NOW (SUN)

Available for domestic and international students, SUN offers Year 10¹, 11 and 12 students the opportunity to study CQUniversity units from degree-level courses while still in secondary school as part of your Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE). Studying a SUN unit may also provide credit toward high school certificates such as SACE, VCE and WACE. In South Australia and Victoria, completion of eligible SUN units may also give you credit toward the calculation of your ATAR.

You can enrol in a range of units, either on campus (face-to-face) or online, and combine them with your regular school work.

START TAFE NOW (STN)

Start TAFE Now is ideal for Year 11 and 12 students, providing an opportunity to study certificate I, certificate II, certificate III, and certificate IV level courses in a wide variety of disciplines.

Benefit from developing real trade skills and qualifications, while completing secondary school. In Queensland, you can study a TAFE course as part of your Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE), and earn QCE points. To be eligible, you need to be at least 15 years of age at the commencement of classes. For more information visit cqu.edu.au/stn.

Year 11 students can include a TAFE certificate III qualification or higher to contribute to the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).

CQUniversity has options available for high schools who have teachers interested in delivering TAFE qualifications at their school in their area of expertise or specialisation. To discuss partnership opportunities, please email stn@cqu.edu.au.

APPRENTICESHIPS AND TRAINEESHIPS

The steps to becoming an apprentice or trainee are different to becoming a student at university or TAFE.

Generally, you will be required to find an employer who is willing to employ you as an apprentice or trainee. During your apprenticeship or traineeship, your employer (or Group Training Organisations/Job Services Australia provider) may arrange for you to undertake vocational education and training at CQUniversity.

If you employ apprentices or trainees, and are seeking a trusted local TAFE training provider, you'll find everything you need at CQUniversity. Our expert teachers deliver quality and industry-relevant training to ensure your apprentices and trainees gain the knowledge and skills needed to succeed.

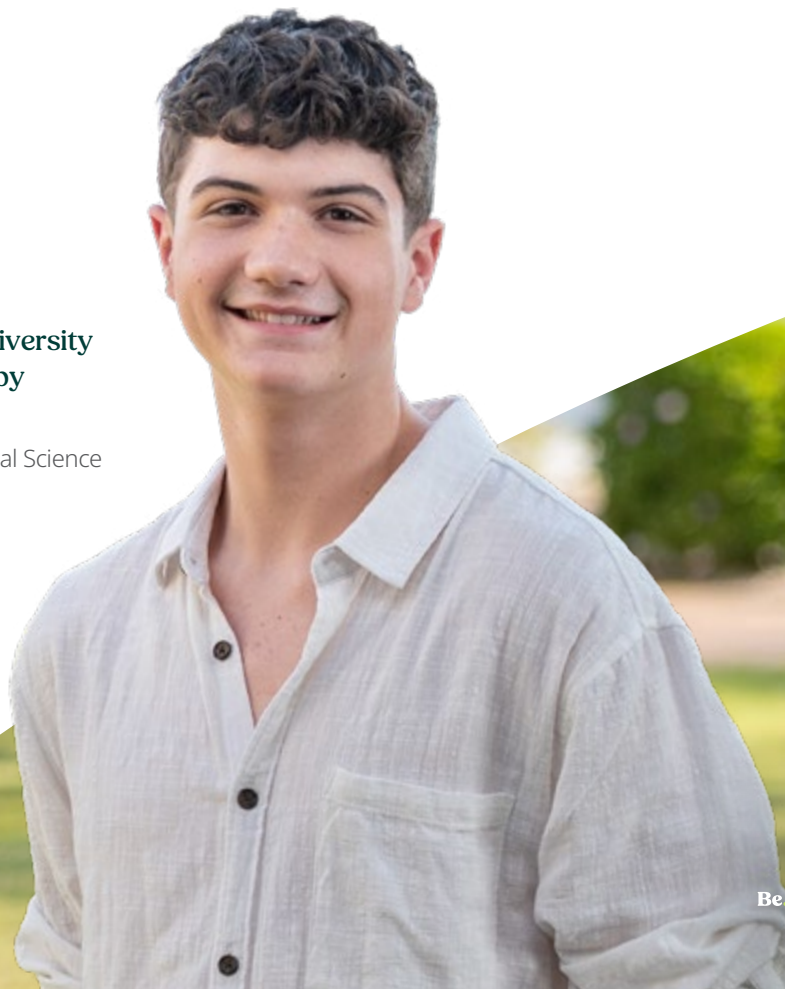
