PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

To participate in the Start TAFE Now program you should:

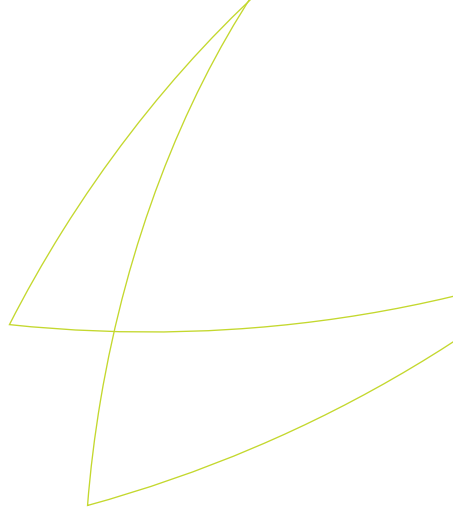
- » have a sound achievement result in Year 10 maths and English subjects (or equivalent) prior to enrolling in the program
- » complete the online Basic Key Skills Builder (BKSB) – a maths and English competency test
- » be a minimum of 15 years of age
- » be in Year 10, 11 or 12
- » provide a copy of all previously completed certificate qualifications
- » remain enrolled in, and attend, a Queensland school or other educational pathway program throughout the duration of enrolment in Start TAFE Now
- » identify the Start TAFE Now program in your Senior Education and Training (SET) plan.

Note: Not all qualifications can be accessed if you are in Year 12, depending on the course duration. Some courses may require the students to meet additional eligibility criteria. Please visit the relevant CQUniversity course web page for more information.

WORK PLACEMENT

Some courses listed within this guide require you to participate in work placement activities relevant to your training. These placement hours are in addition to normal classroom attendance and will be organised and administered by your school, unless otherwise advised.

Some work placements also include mandatory requirements (such as immunisations, a Blue Card, an Australian Federal Police check, etc.), which need to be met prior to attending a placement.



COURSE FEES AND CHARGES

Course fees will vary, visit cqu.edu.au/stn for the most up-to-date information.

You may be able eligible to access the Queensland Government's Vocational Education and Training in Schools (VETiS) program, which enables students to gain nationally recognised qualifications while at school. This means eligible students do not have to pay tuition fees for their VETiS courses. However, there may be other costs associated with the program, such as materials, equipment, or other related expenses.

The courses advertised as VETiS funded in this guide are dependant on eligibility requirements. If eligible, you can complete only one program using VETiS funding. It's important to carefully consider your options before selecting a program.

At CQUniversity we're here to help you every step of the way. If you're interested in studying a Start TAFE Now course in 2025, follow these steps to complete and submit your application.

EXPLORE YOUR OPTIONS

Check out the information within this guide, and talk to your parents or guardians, school VET Coordinator and CQUniversity about the pathways and study options available to help you reach your goals. If you would like further information on any of the TAFE courses available at CQUniversity visit cqu.edu.au/tafe.

Courses within this guide may be VETiS funded or fee for service (full fees payable). Visit cqu.edu.au/stn or email stn@cqu.edu.au for details of costs that may be associated with your chosen course.

WHAT DO I NEED FOR MY APPLICATION?

- » Unique Student Identifier (USI) usi.gov.au/students/get-a-usi
- » Learner Unique Identifier (LUI) (obtain this from your school)
- » Signed Start Now Study Authorisation form – download from cqu.edu.au/stn.

PREPARE FOR ENROLMENT

After submitting your application, you will receive email communication to acknowledge your application and request your completion of the BKSB, with instructions provided to log in and complete the test. Depending on your course, you may be required to complete additional pre-enrolment steps.

ABOUT BKSB

The Basic Key Skills Builder (BKSB) is a maths (numeracy) and English (literacy) assessment tool. Once completed, you will be assigned an Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF) level. This level guides you with advice around course of study and helps identify if literacy and numeracy support is required. Please note that the BKSB must be completed independently.

Once your application has been approved, you will receive a welcome email with the confirmation of your enrolment and Start TAFE Now resources.

IMPORTANT: Your application will not be assessed until completed in full with all supporting documentation and completion of BKSB. Course quota limits may apply.

3. Visit the apply section of the course page and follow the instructions to access the Apply Online portal.
4. Attach your signed Start Now Study Authorisation form.
5. Submit your application.

BOOKKEEPING

FNS30322 - CERTIFICATE III IN ACCOUNTS ADMINISTRATION

Your studies will focus on developing valuable skills that are highly sought after by finance departments. Enhance your employability by gaining formal training in fundamental office procedures such as checking and processing financial data entry, accounts payable, accounts receivable and much more.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles may include inventory clerk, accounts clerk, payroll clerk, accounting operative, accounts receivable clerk and accounts payable clerk.

COMMENCEMENT

We recommend starting this course in Year 10 or 11 due to the study duration.

BUSINESS

BSB30120 - CERTIFICATE III IN BUSINESS

This course provides an advanced understanding of an office environment and will allow you to further your skills in word processing documents, working and communicating effectively, working with spreadsheets, handling mail and filing.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles in business include customer service officer, clerical officer, data entry operator, information officer and more.

COMMENCEMENT

We recommend starting this course in Year 10 or 11 due to the study duration.

CHILDCARE

CHC30121 - CERTIFICATE III IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION AND CARE

This course is a nationally recognised entry-level qualification for working in early childhood education and care. You'll develop skills in assisting with the implementation of an approved learning framework and supporting the wellbeing, learning and development of children.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Employment opportunities may include early childhood educator, school-aged care educator, family day care educator, in-home educator, or nanny.

COMMENCEMENT

We recommend starting this course in Year 10 or 11 due to the study duration.

WORK PLACEMENT

You will be required to organise work placements for the duration of the qualification, with a minimum of 160 hours to complete the vocational placement component.

A Blue Card and COVID-19 vaccination is required for this course.

EDUCATION SUPPORT

CHC30221 - CERTIFICATE III IN SCHOOL BASED EDUCATION SUPPORT

Gain the operational knowledge required for a role as a teacher's assistant. You'll learn how to provide support to teachers and students as needed in various classroom settings.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Opportunities may include roles as an education support worker, education assistant and more.

WORK PLACEMENT

You will be required to organise work placements for the duration of the qualification, with a minimum of 100 hours to complete the vocational placement component of the course.

A Blue Card and COVID-19 vaccination is required for this course.

FITNESS

SIS20122 - CERTIFICATE II IN SPORT AND RECREATION

VETiS funded course

Develop basic knowledge and skills to work in the sport or community recreation industry. A very practical course, that also includes a range of administrative skills.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles in sport and community recreation include activity assistant, customer service assistant, leisure assistant, recreation assistant, retail assistant, grounds assistant, facility assistant and more.

SIS30321 - CERTIFICATE III IN FITNESS

Develop your skills and knowledge in a range of activities and functions requiring autonomous work within a defined range of exercise instruction situations and activities. This course is the entry qualification to work in the fitness industry.

Residential schools and/or workshops are held in Cairns, Mackay, Rockhampton and Bundaberg.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles in fitness include a fitness instructor for a gym and/or group exercise and more.

FITNESS DUAL QUALIFICATION

Explore our fitness dual qualification pathway, a combination of the Certificate II in Sport and Recreation (VETiS-funded course) and Certificate III in Fitness. With the Certificate II in Sport and Recreation seamlessly transferring credits to the Certificate III in Fitness, students benefit from reduced costs while gaining comprehensive training. Please note that this dual qualification is exclusively available to school cohorts, not individual students.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles include activity assistant, customer service assistant, leisure assistant, recreation assistant, retail assistant, grounds assistant, facility assistant, fitness instructor for a gym and/or group exercise and more.

VETiS funded course

Be equipped you with the skills, knowledge and training to provide support for the effective functioning of health services and assisting staff with client care. At this level you'll work on a range of routine and new tasks in collaboration with others in your team under the guidance of a supervisor.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

This qualification provides a pathway to work in a range of health care settings including general practice, hospital settings, health administration, health services organisations, and the public or private health sector.

COMMENCEMENT

We recommend starting this course in Year 10 or 11 due to the study duration.

ON-CAMPUS LEARNING SESSIONS

Mixed mode students will be required to attend a compulsory two-day on-campus learning session prior to undertaking a work placement.

WORK PLACEMENT

You will be required to undertake three days of vocational placement.

COMPULSORY PRE-PLACEMENT CONDITIONS

ANIMAL CARE

ACM20121 - CERTIFICATE II IN ANIMAL CARE

VETiS funded course

This is an ideal entry point into the animal care and management industry, helping you gain experience in working with animals.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles in the animal care and management industry include animal attendant in a kennel, cattery, animal shelter or pet shop.

COMMENCEMENT

We recommend starting this course in Year 10 or 11 due to the study duration.

WORK PLACEMENT

Prior to application, you are required to engage with animal industry care providers in your local area to find suitable work placement, and commit to 120 hours (three weeks) of vocational placement over the duration of the course. Written confirmation of placement is required for admission.



RESOURCE REQUIREMENTS

You will be required to supply your own personal protection equipment including a long-sleeved shirt, broad brimmed hat and sunscreen.



HORTICULTURE

AHC20416 - CERTIFICATE II IN HORTICULTURE

VETiS funded course

As a budding horticulturist you will learn to identify plant and soil types as well as develop your potting, pruning and communication skills.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles in horticulture include horticulture worker, horticulture assistant and more.

COMMENCEMENT

We recommend starting this course in Year 10 or 11 due to the study duration.

WORK PLACEMENT

It is highly recommended that you participate in work experience as part of a partnered schools agreement. No work placement is required if studying on campus.

LABORATORY OPERATIONS

MSL20122 - CERTIFICATE II IN SAMPLING AND MEASUREMENT

VETiS funded course

This qualification offers entry-level training in sampling and measurement skills applicable across a range of industries. Upon completion, you will have the expertise required to perform various sampling and measurements as part of laboratory, production or field operations within the construction, manufacturing, resources and environmental industry sectors.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles in sampling and measurement include sampler and tester, plant operator, production operator, field assistant, production personnel and more.

ON-CAMPUS LEARNING SESSIONS

You will be required to attend two compulsory residential schools in Bundaberg, Rockhampton or Mackay.

SHB20216 - CERTIFICATE II IN SALON ASSISTANT

VETiS funded course

A practical and hands-on qualification designed to immerse you in the vibrant salon environment. You will gain the skills to provide assistance with hairdressing services including basin treatments, colour application, hair drying as well as how to effectively communicate within a team.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

This qualification gives you a sound platform to undertake further training in the hairdressing field. You will need to complete further qualifications as part of an apprenticeship to qualify as a hairdresser. Visit cqu.edu.au/apprenticeships for more information.

HOSPITALITY

SIT20421 - CERTIFICATE II IN COOKERY

VETiS funded course

Start your career in the hospitality industry with this hands-on course that will cover essentials such as workplace health, safety and hygiene, food preparation, presentation, appetisers, stocks, sauces and storage principles.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles include breakfast cook, catering assistant, fast food cook, sandwich hand, take-away cook and more.



SIT20322 - CERTIFICATE II IN HOSPITALITY

VETiS funded course

Develop your skills and knowledge in a range of activities and functions required in hospitality to a basic level. This qualification provides a pathway to work in various hospitality settings such as restaurants, hotels, motels, catering operations, clubs, pubs, cafés and coffee shops.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles in hospitality include function attendant, front desk receptionist, food and beverage attendant, waiter and more.

SIT30622 - CERTIFICATE III IN HOSPITALITY

Gain sound knowledge of hospitality industry operations that can lead to roles in hospitality where you will work with some independence and under limited supervision, and may provide operational advice and support to team members. There is a clear and direct study pathway from this course into SIT50422 - Diploma of Hospitality Management, which will enhance your skills and knowledge in all facets of hospitality.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles in hospitality include espresso coffee machine operator, function attendant, front desk receptionist, food and beverage attendant, restaurant host, senior bar attendant, function host, gaming attendant, waiter and more.



RESOURCE REQUIREMENTS

Certificate II and III in Hospitality: you will be required to wear a polo shirt and enclosed footwear (black school shoes are suitable). You will require access to a computer with internet access and will be provided with a CQUniversity student email address.

Certificate II in Cookery: it is recommended that you have a full chef's uniform (white jacket) and enclosed footwear (black school shoes are suitable).

TOURISM

SIT20122 - CERTIFICATE II IN TOURISM

VETiS funded course

Begin your career in the tourism and travel industry. Employment opportunities exist in multiple tourism industry facilities, travel agencies, hotels, restaurants, theme parks, transportation and many other exciting areas.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Roles in tourism include office assistant, conference organiser, small tour operator, sales assistant, ride attendant, receptionist and more.

PRACTICAL REQUIREMENTS

Practical skills will need to be demonstrated in an industry or simulated environment. Students not currently working in the industry or who don't have access to workplace simulated environments will need to organise this in consultation with teaching staff.



RESOURCE REQUIREMENTS

You will require access to a computer with internet access. A CQUniversity student email address will be provided to you.



SIT30122 - CERTIFICATE III IN TOURISM

If you are seeking a career where you can combine work with your passion for travel then this course may be for you. Your studies will focus on developing a range of tourism sales, operational and tour delivery skills. This course has a practical focus, ensuring you graduate work ready and are equipped with the skills needed to enter the diverse and dynamic tourism industry.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Some possible job titles include: adventure tourism guide, attendant or senior ride operator in an attraction or theme park, museum attendant, reservation sales agent, or visitors information officer.

VETiS funded course

Rev up your skills and knowledge required to perform a range of servicing operations on light and heavy vehicles within automotive services or repair businesses.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Career opportunities include trades assistant, vehicle service assistant, automotive service assistant, automotive trainee and a gateway to an apprenticeship in light, heavy or auto electrical.

COMMENCEMENT

This course is recommended for Year 11 and 12.

VETiS funded course

Designed for those seeking an apprenticeship in the electrical industry that covers safety and basic skills and knowledge for work in an electrotechnology discipline. Some units attained in this qualification provide credit towards a listed apprenticeship training plan.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Successful completion enhances your employment opportunities if you are seeking an apprenticeship in the electrical trades.

COMMENCEMENT

This course is recommended for Year 11.

VETiS funded course

It is recommended that students are undertaking general mathematics and/or science/technology subjects at school or have a keen interest in coding and robotics. You'll learn to understand the programming language Python and use some of the coding, programming and simulator technologies.

Career opportunities exist in a range of technical, engineering, trade and information communication technology, innovative thinking, networking and programming fields.

COMMENCEMENT

MEM20422 - CERTIFICATE II IN ENGINEERING PATHWAYS

VETiS funded course

You will develop skills in communication, teamwork, problem solving, initiative and enterprise, planning and organising, self management and skills relevant to the industry.

We recommend starting this course in Year 10 or 11 due to the study duration.

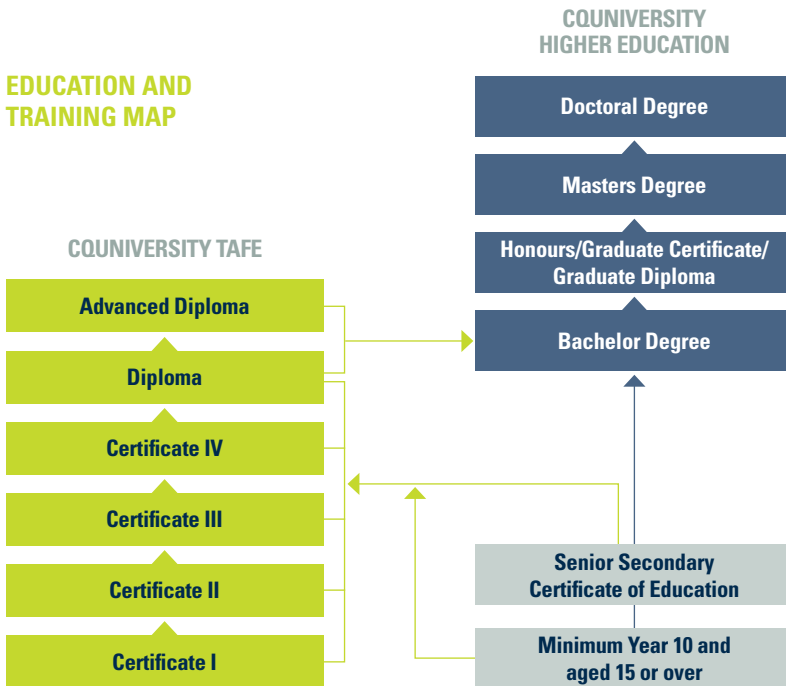

APPRENTICESHIPS AND TRAINEESHIPS

CQUniversity has a range of apprenticeship and traineeship courses available. Apprenticeships and traineeships combine the benefits of structured training and paid employment. Undertaken on a full-time or school-based structure, apprenticeships and traineeships enable you to learn a trade or skill and receive a nationally-accredited qualification.

Traineeships can be one to two years in a range of vocational areas, while apprenticeships usually last three to four years to become a qualified tradesperson.

SECURING AN APPRENTICESHIP OR TRAINEESHIP

Students wishing to complete an Apprenticeship or Traineeship should follow the below steps:

1. Find an employer

An important part of starting an apprenticeship or traineeship is finding an employer that will help to train and employ you through until the completion of your apprenticeship or traineeship. There are many options when choosing an employer – this can be through job search sights or through a Group Training Organisation (GTO).

2. Choose an Australian Apprenticeship Support Network (AASN) provider.

Once employed, the employer will need to choose an AASN provider to sign up the apprentice or trainee and arrange the training contract. The employer will specify what Registered Training Organisation (RTO) the apprentice or trainee will be attending. The employee will apply for the apprentice or trainee via their chosen AASN.

3. Choose CQUniversity

CQUniversity is the Supervising Registered Training Organisation (SRTO) and will oversee the training of the apprentice or trainee throughout their qualification. CQUniversity is responsible for providing students with the knowledge, skills and training to help students achieve their career aspirations.





SCHOOL-BASED APPRENTICESHIP OR TRAINEESHIP

A school-based apprenticeship or traineeship is a great way to kickstart your career before you leave school. As a high school student in Year 10, 11 or 12, you can combine work, study and training to get a head start on your chosen career path. You'll get ahead on your studies, gain valuable experience in a real workplace and get paid while you do it.

To get a school-based apprenticeship or traineeship started you should talk to your school's VET Coordinator to discuss how this would affect your school timetable and ATAR score.

WHO CAN UNDERTAKE A SCHOOL-BASED APPRENTICESHIP?

To undertake a School-Based Apprenticeship students must:

- » be 15 years old or older, and in years 10, 11 or 12 at a registered Queensland High School
- » have support from their school
- » have permission from their parent or guardian, if under 18.

SAT conditions may apply to entry requirements for specific courses such as Electrotechnology. Visit the Queensland Governments' eligibility for more details.

AVAILABILITY DEFINITIONS

On-campus: Students studying in on-campus mode are typically expected to attend and participate in regular, structured on-campus teaching and learning activities throughout the University's academic term. These activities may include lectures, tutorials, workshops, practical work, or online or other activities, and will be timetabled at a University campus or delivery site.

Online: Students studying in online mode are not required to physically attend on-campus teaching or learning activities. The course is predominantly delivered online or through other distance education activities, assisted by electronic communication and computer-based education technology. Course content is studied through several methods, including online discussion forums, electronic library resources, by contacting lecturers and teachers via email, and by accessing study materials online. Online students can access a range of educational and non-educational University support services through the University's extensive network of campuses and study centres. Residential schools and off-campus work-integrated learning, including work placements, may be included in some courses studied through online mode.

Mixed Mode: Students studying mixed mode learn via a combination of online learning activities in addition to site-specific learning. This may include residential schools, co-op placements and/or work-integrated learning as a compulsory requirement of a unit.
