FORM INSTRUCTIONS

PURPOSE

This form helps you assess your eligibility for entry into the Bachelor of Psychological Science (Honours). It calculates your Grade Point Average (GPA) based on your best second- and third-year APAC-accredited psychology units.

HOW TO USE

1. Select your Units

- Enter the grade for your third-year Research Methods, Statistics or equivalent unit in the first row.
- Choose nine (9) additional second- and third-year APAC-accredited psychology units that you've completed.
- If you have fewer than 10 eligible units, you must enter at least 8 second- and third-year APAC-accredited psychology units – for the remaining blank rows, keep 'Select' in the Grade column.
- If you have received a credit transfer or exemption for a second- or third-year APAC accredited psychology unit, select 'Exempt' in the Grade column. Do not enter zero (0), as this will negatively affect your GPA calculation.

2. Fill in the table

- Enter the unit details as they appear on your academic transcript, ensuring you populate the following details for each individual unit:
 - Institution (e.g. CQUniversity Australia)
 - Psychology Unit Code (e.g. PSYC13015)
 - Psychology Unit Name (e.g. Research Methods)
 - Year Completed (e.g. 2025)
 - Grade (e.g. Distinction) – If your academic transcript uses a different grading system (e.g., H1, H2, etc., or A, B, etc.) rather than a seven (7)-point GPA scale, please convert your grades using the Grade Conversion Table on the last page of this document.

3. Order your Units

- Enter your third-year Research Methods, Statistics or equivalent in the first row.
- List your remaining units from highest grade to lowest grade.

4. Your GPA

- The form will automatically calculate your Grade Point Average (GPA).

5. Submit your application

- If your GPA is above the minimum requirement of 5.5, we welcome you to apply.
- Upload the following documentation with your application:
 - A copy of your official academic transcript demonstrating completion of your APAC accredited psychology Bachelor degree
 - A completed CC42 – Bachelor of Psychological Science (Honours) Self Assessment Form
 - If applicable, an official academic transcript from the institution where you received any credit transfers
 - If applicable, an Australian Psychology Society (APS) assessment confirming comparability to an Australian psychology education pathway for entry into an APAC accredited psychology course
 - If applicable, documentation demonstrating work/life experience, professional development, or research work relevant to psychology (required for degrees completed more than 10 years from the Term commencement date)

Important Notes

- Only include second- and third-year APAC-accredited psychology units.
- Do not include first-year units or non-psychology electives.
- If you repeated a unit, use the most recent grade.
