PERFORMANCE INFO

TERM 2: OPEN CLASS

In Week 8 of Term 2 (11 June), students will present an Open Class for parents, family and friends at the CQCM Theatre. Students are expected to wear their Con Academy uniform and class times are as per normal. Concert & costume information will be distributed at this class.

TERM 3: PUBLIC CONCERT

Week 9 of Term 3 (10 & 11 September), the students will present an end of term concert for the Conservatorium Academy. Dress rehearsal for all students will be on Saturday 10 September from 9.00am to 3.00pm in the CQCM Theatre. There will be two public performances on Sunday 11 September in the CQCM Theatre at 1pm and 4pm. Costs and booking information will be provided at the beginning of Semester 2. All further concert information will be conveyed at the Open Class in Term 2.

UNIFORM

All students will be required to wear the Conservatorium Academy uniform. This consists of:

- Conservatorium Academy Polo Shirt
- Girls: Black jazz pants, leggings or shorts
- Boys: Black shorts or comfortable long pants
- Girls and boys: Black Elasta booties

Shoes are available at any dance wear shop

MAKE-UP

Parents are required to purchase stage make-up for their child. This is usually a one-off purchase and can be used for several years. If your child already owns make-up for drama or dance, then this will be suitable for Conservatorium Academy performances. Most students will be able to wear heavy day make-up. Students in Senior Theatre may need to wear false eyelashes. False eyelashes are not required for students of Junior or Intermediate Theatre.

COSTUMES

Parents are responsible for the cost of their child's costume. While every effort is made to source costumes at an affordable rate, it is expected that this will not exceed \$100. Some costumes may be sourced much more cheaply this, or there may be a hire fee.

SHOES & HOSIERY

Students will mostly wear their usual class shoes for performances. Parents will be required to provide appropriate socks or tights for class and performance

PROPS FOR PERFORMANCE

The end of year concert will require a small amount of stage and personal props. Parents are asked to help source these props and students will need to use these during the year as required.

HAIR

During class, please ensure your child's hair is tied back off the face.

REGISTRATION (Musical Theatre)

All students who attend the Conservatorium Academy must complete a *Registration Form and Talent Release Form* and students will not be permitted to commence classes until the form has been received. This form requires contact information, general medical information that staff need to be aware of, and requires parents/ guardians to agree to adhere to the University policies and procedures regarding the use of University facilities.

FEES (Musical Theatre only)

Payment of fees can be made online. An email containing the link to pay fees will be emailed to applicants once the registration form has been received by the CQCM office.

There are no weekly rates available.

Students who have outstanding fees on Friday 25 March 2022 (Term 1), Friday 20 May 2022 (Term 2) or Friday 12 August 2022 (Term 3) will not be permitted to attend class until the fees are paid in full and will incur a \$55 late fee.

PLEASE NOTE

Fees cannot be paid through the CQCM office. Refunds are not available for change of mind or change of circumstances.

ABSENCE FROM CLASS

If your child is going to be absent from class, we ask you to email academy@cqu.edu.au or phone the CQCM office on 07 4940 7800. There will be no refund or transfer of fees for absences.

PARENT VIEWING

To enable the delivery of the most effective lessons, parents are not permitted to watch any classes from inside the studio. During performances, unauthorised taking of photos or videos is not permitted.

DUTY OF CARE / SAFETY

In accordance with University policies and procedures, minors MUST be supervised at all times while they are on campus.

THIS IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF PARENTS AND GUARDIANS.

Conservatorium Academy teachers are responsible for the students while they are in their classes, however University or Academy staff are not responsible for students who are dropped off at the Conservatorium well before the class begins or well after the class has finished.

While classes are in progress, parents are welcome to wait in their vehicle or to leave the campus in the interim.

Please ensure your child is collected immediately after their class has finished from the entrance of the Conservtorium.
