Graduation Statement

The Bachelor of Nursing (Enrolled Nurse Pathway) is an undergraduate degree consisting of 96 compulsory units of credit, taught in English, which has a duration of 2 years of full-time study or part-time equivalent. Students entering into the course in Term 2 will be able to complete the course in 2.5 years full-time or part-time equivalent.

Students should concentrate on completing all first-year units before moving on to second year units, and all second-year units before moving on to third year units.

Course Duration Requirements

Full Time Duration 2 years

Part Time Duration 4 years

The maximum time to complete the CM77 Bachelor of Nursing (Enrolled Nurse Pathway) course is 7 years to meet Recency of Practice and eligibility for registration as a nurse (Division 1) in Australia (Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA)).

Please also note that if you do not successfully complete your units on the first attempt, or take a Leave of Absence, your course duration and completion timeframe may be extended.

Professional Accreditation

The Bachelor of Nursing is accredited by the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC). The Bachelor of Nursing leads to eligibility for registration as a nurse (Division 1) in Australia.

Course Structure Requirements

In the CM77 Bachelor of Nursing (Enrolled Nurse Pathway) course, students are required to complete the following course structure:

- 14 Core Units

Professional Nursing Practice

Professional Nursing Practice (PNP) is an activity that integrates academic learning with its application in the workplace. In nursing, it is referred to as placement or professional nursing practice. Attending professional nursing practice is not automatic. To be eligible to attend clinical placement students must satisfy a list of requirements known as [Pre-WIL Mandatory Conditions or Mandatory Checks](#).

The pre-clinical mandatory check submission deadline occurs up to three months prior to the commencement of each term that you are enrolled in. This date is to ensure that your mandatory checks are in order before you are deemed eligible to attend and are allocated a professional nursing practice the following term. You should allow sufficient time to familiarise yourself with what is required of you and the timelines involved.

These requirements are set in accordance with the University's approval:

- Vaccination Principles
- Work Integrated Learning Policy and Procedure

In addition, there may be student professional nursing practice requirements specified by contracted industry partners.

It is your responsibility to keep these checks up-to-date and to adhere to the Pre-WIL Compulsory Condition requirements for your own safety and the safety of others during your professional nursing practice.

Failure to complete all pre-WIL Compulsory Conditions by the publicised deadline will disqualify you from attending professional nursing practice and will significantly impact your ability to complete your course in your desired timeframe.

Once you accept your offer and have your student login details, you will have access to the Moodle site [Nursing Central](#). Nursing Central provides a link to the [Professional Nursing Practice \(Work Integrated Learning\) Moodle site](#).

All mandatory check evidence must be submitted via the university placement management system SONIA.

A minimum of 560 hours professional nursing practice in an off-campus health care setting is an integral component of the Bachelor of Nursing (Enrolled Nurse Pathway) course. (Students may be required to complete more than 560 hours due to some organisations make up time policy).

NB. Depending on clinical placement availability, you may be required to travel within or outside of your state to complete your professional nursing practice.

Professional Nursing Practices are organised in blocks of time as per the relevant unit requirement. They are located in various health care organisations throughout Australia where a service agreement is in place and are therefore not negotiable.
