COURSE STRUCTURE

You will complete 10 core units and 2 field education units.

The core units include:

- › Social Work Field Education 1: Hands-on experience in a supervised social work setting.
- › Ethical and Legal Issues in Practice: Examination of ethical dilemmas and legal frameworks in social work.
- › Interviewing, Negotiation and Mediation Skills: Developing essential communication skills.
- › History, Culture, and Diversity: Understanding the historical and cultural context of social work through developing an understanding working with Australian First Nation's peoples and culturally diverse communities.
- › Psychosocial Perspectives on Health and Illness: Exploring the intersection of health, illness, and social work.
- › Social Work Theories and the Practice Context: Application of social work theories in practice.
- › Working with Families, Groups, and Communities: Strategies for effective social work practice in diverse settings.
- › Interpersonal, Family, and Structural Violence: Addressing violence across various areas of social work practice.
- › Social Work Field Education 2: Advanced practical experience in a professional setting.
- › Capstone Project: Integrating the skills and knowledge developed during the learning process.

FIELD EDUCATION

A cornerstone of our course, field education offers you two 500-hour supervised placements to apply your learning in real-world environments. Under expert supervision, you will engage in various methods of change, including casework, direct practice, community development, group work, and policy.

These placements allow you to seamlessly integrate theoretical knowledge with practical experience.

Additionally, opportunities for regional Queensland placements are available for the second placement.

CAREER OUTCOMES

You will be well-equipped for social work roles such as case manager, hospital social worker, family support worker, mental health social worker, child and family practitioner, community development practitioner, policy officer, and school social worker.

The health care and human services sector, a primary provider of new jobs in Australia, continues to grow, offering robust employment opportunities for our graduates.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Academic: Successful completion of an undergraduate degree in human services, social sciences, or a related discipline.

If you don't meet the academic entry requirements, you can start with the Graduate Certificate in First Nations Public Health as a pathway into the Master of Social Work (Qualifying). The fee for this pathway course is A\$17 880.

English: As per Australian Social Work Education and Accreditation Standards (ASWEAS) requirements.

- › IELTS (Academic) score of 7.0 overall, with no individual band score less than 7.0.
- › TOEFL (iBT) score of 94 overall, with no individual score less than 24 for reading and listening, 23 for speaking, and 27 for writing.
- › PTE Academic score of 65 overall, with no individual band score less than 65.

ACCREDITATION

The course is accredited with the Australian Association of Social Workers (AASW). For more details on the accreditation process and standards, please visit aasw.asn.au.
