## **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

To be eligible for entry, you must complete your high school studies in the year prior to starting CQU's Bachelor of Medical Science (Pathway to Medicine). You must complete English (Units 3 and 4, C); Mathematical Methods (Units 3 and 4, C) or equivalent; one of physics, chemistry, or biology (Units 3 and 4, C) or equivalent.

Entry is competitive with a limited number of places (20 places in Bundaberg and 20 places in Rockhampton). The minimum entry score required is ATAR 95.0 (Adjusted). Entry will also require a competitive University Clinical Aptitude Test for Australia and New Zealand (UCAT ANZ) aggregate score. Eligible applicants will be invited to attend a Multiple Mini Interview (MMI) as part of the selection process. We encourage all interested applicants to apply regardless of their UCAT score.

### **BONDED VS NON-BONDED PLACE**

You can apply for both (or either) a Non-Bonded and a Bonded Medical Place. The Bonded Medical Program is a government initiative to provide more Australian-trained doctors in areas of workforce shortage, particularly in regional, rural and remote Australia. # **ASSISTANCE SCHEMES**

### SUBJECT INCENTIVE SCHEME

If you are applying for the Bachelor of Medical Science (Pathway to Medicine) you may be eligible to receive ATAR/rank adjustments for successfully completing specific Year 12 subjects or university-level study while at school.

#### **RURAL ACCESS SCHEME**

The Rural Access Scheme may allow you to apply for 2 ATAR/rank adjustments if you have lived in rural Australia, or 3 ATAR/rank adjustments if you have lived in both rural Australia and Central Queensland or Wide Bay.

#### START UNI NOW (SUN) APPROVED UNITS

SUN is a CQUniversity initiative that offers high school students the opportunity to complete university units while still in high school. Completing an approved SUN unit/s from the Bachelor of Medical Science (Pathway to Medicine) will provide you with a maximum of 1 ATAR/rank adjustment when applying for the Bachelor of Medical Science (Pathway to Medicine).

If you're successful in gaining admission into the Bachelor of Medical Science (Pathway to Medicine), you may be eligible for credit transfer for successful completion of specified SUN units.

#### STEP 1: COMPLETE YOUR UCAT ANZ

The University Clinical Aptitude Test Australia New Zealand (UCAT ANZ) is a test used by universities to help select the most appropriate applicants for clinical careers. The UCAT ANZ is a computer-based test delivered in Pearson VUE test centres.

#### **STEP 2: APPLY THROUGH QTAC**

For CQUniversity's Bachelor of Medical Science (Pathway to Medicine), QTAC applications open in early August and will close in late September.

#### **STEP 3: ATTEND MULTI MINI INTERVIEWS (MMIS)**

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to participate in the MMI. MMIs are designed to assess your non-academic qualities and provide you with opportunities to demonstrate skills and qualities such as verbal communication, adaptability, and empathy.

The MMIs involve a circuit of interview stations. At each station, you will respond to a scenario with a number of questions.

You will move from one station to the next, with short breaks between each station. While there will be multiple applicants attending the MMIs, you are interviewed individually at each station.
