

If you are an international high school student, please refer to information on pages 8 and 9 to understand the requirements and eligibility criteria relevant to you.

ABOUT START UNI NOW

Start Uni Now (SUN) is a CQUniversity initiative that gives you the opportunity to study university-level units while in Years 10^{*}, 11 and 12 at high school.

SUN allows you to enrol in a range of CQUniversity units and after successfully completing study in SUN you may be eligible for direct entry into your course and credit towards your degree. You can be confident knowing you have a pathway to university that is not just reliant on your ATAR score, which you can combine with your regular high school work.

IS SUN FOR YOU?

- » Do you want to get a head start with study and your future career?
- » Do you want to further challenge yourself in your final years of high school?
- » Are you a high-achieving student?
- » Are you self-motivated and can manage your own time effectively?

If so, SUN could be for you. Learn about the benefits, eligibility and more.

HOW MUCH DOES SUN COST?

Your first unit in the SUN program is free. As a domestic student, subsequent units (up to an additional three units) are offered at a significantly discounted rate of \$375 per unit. If you are an international student (studying either in Australia or outside of Australia), you will be liable for full tuition fees for your subsequent SUN unit. In addition to the unit cost, there may be other expenses such as textbooks and resources. Fees must be paid up-front and cannot be deferred to HECS-HELP, but you may be eligible for financial assistance options.

As a SUN student you can potentially save thousands of dollars and minimise any future HECS-HELP debt.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF SUN?

SNEAK PEEK

SUN provides you with an insight into university life and helps you understand the expectations of studying at a tertiary level. This will help prepare you for the transition from high school to university.

DIRECT ENTRY

After successful completion of SUN, you may be eligible to apply for direct entry into an undergraduate degree at CQUniversity (excluding quota managed courses). A quota managed course has a set limit on the number of students who may be admitted in any academic year. As a result, some courses are not available for direct entry. Quota managed courses include:

- » Bachelor of Echocardiography and Cardiac Physiology/Graduate Diploma of Echocardiography (CV69)
- » Bachelor of Medical Sonography/ Graduate Diploma of Medical Sonography (CG91)
- » Bachelor of Medical Science (Pathway to Medicine) (CM17)
- » Bachelor of Medical Imaging (CG92)
- » Bachelor of Oral Health (CB29)
- » Bachelor of Physiotherapy (Honours) (CB85)
- » Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours) (CB84)
- » Diploma of Nursing (HLT54121).

As a domestic student eligible to apply for direct entry to a non quota managed course, you will not need to apply and wait for an offer through a tertiary admissions centre, such as Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) and Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC). To be eligible for direct entry, you must:

- » pass at least one SUN unit from the undergraduate degree you are applying for
- » show evidence of successful completion of Australian Year 12 (or equivalent) studies.

You may also need to meet specific requirements for entry into your chosen degree. For more details, visit **cqu.edu.au** and search 'Study After SUN'.

CREDIT TRANSFERS

If you enrol as a CQUniversity student after Year 12, you may be eligible to receive a credit transfer for each SUN unit you have passed. Provided these SUN units are part of your degree at the time of your undergraduate admission, a credit transfer would count towards your degree. This will reduce the number of units you need to study when you start university and may reduce the duration of your university course.

Credit transfers towards courses at other universities should be discussed with the relevant university.

MEET TERTIARY ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

SUN can also provide a valuable pathway for students who need to meet prerequisite subject requirements to gain entry into university. Depending on the degree you wish to apply for, studying SUN units may allow you to meet English, science and maths entry requirements for courses at CQUniversity.

Students intending to utilise SUN units in order to meet tertiary pre-requisites should discuss with the SUN team and/or relevant university prior to enrolment.



WHERE CAN I STUDY SUN?

SUN units can be studied either on campus or online, which means you can choose a way of studying that suits you best, regardless of where you live.

Studying online is the most popular mode of study chosen by SUN students as it allows you to fit university study around your current school timetable. As a SUN student, you will require regular access to the internet and a reliable computer. Whilst most of your study will be online, you may still be required to attend an on-campus or face to face exam.

If you would prefer to study on campus, contact the SUN team by visiting **cqu.edu.au/sun**.

If you are an international student, you can study SUN units online only.

RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS

Some online units may require compulsory residential school attendance. Residential schools require you to attend a designated campus for up to five days to undertake practical components of your study.

To find details of residential school dates, visit **cqu.edu.au/timetables** or scan the below QR code and complete the following steps:

- Under the 'Search Timetables' heading, enter the unit code for your desired unit (these codes can be found in this guide).

WHAT LEVEL OF COMMITMENT IS INVOLVED?

It is recommended that you dedicate between 10 – 12 hours of study to your SUN unit per week (over a 12 – 14 week period). Studying a SUN unit requires good time management skills, the ability to work independently and a proactive attitude. University study is very flexible and this allows you to work your study time around other commitments such as a part-time job or sport.

You can study your SUN unit after school and on weekends. You may also choose to study a SUN unit as your sixth subject choice at school. You should speak with your school Guidance Officer or Principal to discuss the best way for you to manage your study commitments.

Successful applicants may study one SUN unit per university term, and you'll have the opportunity to study up to four SUN units in total over the senior school period (pending unit availability).

WHAT SUPPORT DO I RECEIVE AS A SUN STUDENT?

Regardless of whether you study on campus or online, you have access to many of the same resources and support services as other CQUniversity students.

DEDICATED SUN SUPPORT

You'll have access to the CQU SUN team to support you throughout your SUN study journey.

ACADEMIC RESOURCES

Through our Acadmic Learning Centre (ALC), you can access information, advice and resources related to academic writing, mathematics, science and computing requirements of your studies.

ADVICE AND COUNSELLING

Our Students Directorate offer a range of services including academic and personal counselling, study skills advice and time management strategies.

ACCESSIBILITY AND EQUITY

If you have a disability, illness, injury, mental health condition or medical condition – temporary, fluctuating or ongoing – CQU's Student Accessibility and Equity team is dedicated to helping you succeed in your studies and training.

Available support may include:

- » flexibility with coursework deadlines
- » specific arrangements to complete exams or online timed assessments

AM I ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR SUN?

To be eligible to apply for SUN you must provide evidence of the following as per your most recent school report card:

- » enrolled in Year 11 or 12 (Year 10 students are eligible for Term 3 enrolment only)
- » achieving an average B grade (or better) across all school subjects
- » passing all school subjects.

Achieving a B grade in ATAR-level English is strongly recommended for SUN units.

You will also require permission from your Principal or school nominee and a parent or guardian.

Students undertaking non-standard curriculum or home-schooling are also eligible to apply for SUN. For details on application requirements, please visit **cqu.edu.au/sun**.

HOW TO APPLY

Submit your application online and include the following:

- » your Learner Unique Identifier (LUI)
- » your signed SUN Authorisation Form
- » a copy of your most recent term/ semester school report card verifying your eligibility.

HOW DO I CHOOSE A SUN UNIT?

SUN offers first-year university units from almost every CQUniversity bachelor degree.

When selecting the unit you wish to apply for it is important to consider the following questions:

- » What career are you interested in pursuing?
- » What course is required to pursue that career?
- » Does the SUN unit form part of the requirements for that course?
- » Is the unit offered in the term you wish to study?
- » Is the unit available on campus, online or both?

DO I RECEIVE CREDIT TOWARDS MY ATAR?

SUN study may credit towards your ATAR in Victoria and South Australia. For further information refer to the SUN Guidelines at **cqu.edu.au/sun**.

If you are applying for the Bachelor of Medical Science (Pathway to Medicine), you may receive an ATAR adjustment on successful completion of an eligible SUN unit. For more information visit **cqu.edu.au** and search 'Other Admission Consideration'.

DO I RECEIVE CREDIT TOWARDS MY STATE CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION?

SUN study may provide credit towards your state's respective Certificate of Education. There are currently arrangements in place that provide credit towards the Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) and some credit toward the Western Australia Certificate of Education (WACE), South Australia Certificate of Education (SACE) and Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE).

There are currently no arrangements in place to provide credit for those students undertaking their Higher School Certificate (HSC NSW), Northern Territory Certificate of Education (NTCE) or Tasmanian Certificate of Education (TCE).

It is strongly encouraged that you and your parent/guardian talk to your nominated school's contact in regards to potential credit options. Students should seek approval for credit prior to their SUN enrolment. For full details refer to the SUN Guidelines at **cqu.edu.au/sun**.



INTERNATIONAL SUN STUDENTS

If you are an international high school student studying in Australia or in your home country, we offer a wide range of courses to suit your individual needs and interests and to help you achieve your future study and career ambitions.

AM I ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR SUN?

To be eligible to apply for SUN you must:

- » be enrolled in Australian Curriculum Year 11 or 12 (or equivalent), UK A Level Curriculum, the International Baccalaureate, Polytechnic^{*}, or other equivalent senior high school^{*} curriculum
- » be achieving equivalent to an average B grade (or better) across all Australian school subjects as per your most recent report card[†]
- » achieve an English level of IELTS 5.5 across all bands or equivalent from an approved English language test. We will also accept IGCSE/GSCE Grade C in English Language and International Baccalaureate MYP Certificate Grade 4 in English.

A variation of English language requirements may be considered. A higher English language proficiency may apply for specialist courses. See the following page for details.

HOW MUCH DOES SUN COST?

As an international student, you will receive a full (100%) subsidy for your first SUN unit enrolment. Fees for subsequent enrolments will be charged at the rates applicable in the undergraduate section of the tuition fee schedule at **cqu.edu.au/int-sun**.

In addition to the unit cost, there may be other expenses such as textbooks and resources. Fees must be paid up-front.

DO I RECEIVE CREDIT TOWARDS MY ATAR? (ONSHORE INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS)

SUN study may provide credit towards your ATAR in Victoria and South Australia. For more details refer to the SUN Guidelines at **cqu.edu.au/int-sun**.

WHERE CAN I STUDY SUN

You can study SUN regardless of where you live. SUN units can be studied either on-campus (if you live in Australia) or online by online study. You can choose a way of studying that suits you best.

If you are already in Australia and are interested in studying your SUN unit on-campus, you may have the opportunity to do so at one of CQUniversity's many campus locations.

HOW TO APPLY

To apply for entry into SUN visit **cqu.edu.au/int-sun** and review the *How to Apply* section.

You must submit a copy of your most recent school term/semester report card with the SUN application, as well as gain both parental/guardian and school approval.
